About the museum

The Cater Museum is dedicated to the history of the town and its community. An independent registered charity, it opened in 1960 in an 18th Century Grade II listed red brick fronted building: 74 High Street, Billericay.

Alice May Cater purchased the building to provide Billericay with a museum, establishing it in honour of her late husband William who was a local antiquarian.

Its first Curator, Harry Richman was tasked with bringing together a collection of objects relating to the history of Billericay. Richman had previously exhibited his private "Town Collection" in The Reading Rooms and these along with donations from other private collectors (Alice Cater, Anthony Nicholl, Alfred Basil Brooks and the Eales family) form the core of the current collection.



The museum covers 3 floors, and objects in its collection include: the door of the house once owned by Christopher Martin (a passenger aboard the Mayflower); artefacts from the Zeppelin downed in the area during World War I; trade coins from the time when Billericay issued its own currency; items from the Ritz Cinema in Chapel Street; a large axe grindstone from Hurlocks Farm and Victorian costumes.

We also have a wealth of information on local families and buildings.
